**LOBSTER** – The co-ordinating committee has offered to pay for lobster at one meal! Probably it will Thursday supper, including salads and cold cuts (for those who do not like them or are allergic)... They will be cooked outside and eaten outside if it's warm enough.

**WEATHER** – Who knows what it will be like, but we've had a cool, damp spring . Layered clothing and waterproof footwear are recommended. The grounds between buildings and the walking trail could be quite damp.

**EXTRA NIGHTS and meals**—A few of you are coming early, like Sunday evening and Monday. The cost for the planning committee will be covered by DUCC. For those not on the committee, the cost is \$35 a night for a room, and meals are about \$11-13 each. Plus HST 15%. Prior to the event, there will be meals available at the Centre on Monday evening, and Tuesday breakfast.
